

# How to Do Business With Tobyhanna Army Depot

## D-U-N-S

Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) provides a D-U-N-S Number, a unique nine digit identification number, for each physical location of your business. D-U-N-S Number assignment is FREE for all businesses required to register with the US Federal government for contracts or grants. ## CCR

You'll need to register with the federal government's [Central Contractor Registration \(CCR\)](#), the primary database of vendors doing business with the federal government. Federal acquisitions regulations require all prospective vendors to be registered in CCR prior to the award of a contract; basic agreement, basic ordering agreement, or blanket purchase agreement. You can register on-line by completing an electronic questionnaire at the [CCR](#) Web site.

## ASFI

For simplified acquisition, Tobyhanna Army Depot advertises our request for quotes under the ASFI (Army Single Face to Industry) website <https://acquisition.army.mil/asfi>, any of the various criteria can be used to search those opportunities of interest.

**FOR FORMAL SOLICITATIONS** (IFBs, RFPs, RFQs ...) : <https://abop.monmouth.army.mil> - users must register for full access (usually takes 24 hours to receive password) ; on the IBOP site, at "Army Solicitation", for current solicitations, select "CECOM 2009", then click Go; type in you user name and password; towards the top of the next screen, various means of searching are available at "Sort by" such as solicitation number, or W25G1V, or other suitable method. Note the IBOP, Interactive Business Opportunities Page, is also known as the ABOP, Army Business Opportunities Page.

**FOR SYNOPSES OF OPPORTUNITIES** and many formal solicitations on FedBizOps at <https://www.fbo.gov/> -- FedBizOpps.gov is the single government point-of-entry (GPE) for Federal government procurement opportunities over \$25,000. Government buyers are able to publicize their business opportunities by posting information directly to FedBizOpps via the Internet.

## PTAC

Procurement Technical Assistance Centers (PTACs) form a nationwide network of procurement professionals dedicated to providing you - *at little or no cost*:

- An understanding of the requirements of government contracting, and
- the know-how to obtain and perform federal, state, and local government contracts
